AUGUST 3, 2009**

1. Call to Order

- 2. However, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 : "Nothing in this Act shall be construed to limit the discretion of a public body to permit, prohibit or regulate the active participation at any meeting,...."

Speakers at Borough meetings shall have five minutes to present their comments to the Borough Council so as not to consume time that would otherwise be allotted to other persons who wish to speak. Speakers shall be courteous to the Council and other persons attending the meeting. Offensive remarks or unruly behavior will not be allowed and anyone who violates this policy will be barred from participating in the meeting.

The Mayor asked for a moment of silence to remember our troops fighting overseas.

1. Discussion on the Great American Trolley.

Councilman Sadow stated he will be conducting a survey at the Park & Ride lot during commuter hours after Labor Day to determine rider usage; we will have a better idea of the possibility of a trolley for commuters towards the end of September.

2. Letter from Joseph Weaver regarding the status of 126 Orben Drive.

Mayor and Council agreed we are moving in the right direction on this issue.

3. Council Committee Reports.

Councilman Driscoll, Finance: We, nor any other municipality, have heard anything about the extraordinary aid as of yet.

Councilman Doran, Fire/Rescue: The fire equipment is back at the firehouse; they will be notified 24 hours in advance from Daren Phil before they do the final paving on Howard Boulevard. The internal work at the firehouse should begin shortly.

Council President Cerasoli, DPW: Submitted year to date tonnage reports with regard to recycling along with the total report for last year. Councilwoman Galate stated that private disposal companies can give dumping receipts to the municipality for recycling; she will look into the private communities in the Borough.

Councilwoman Galate, Police: the Police Department will be setting up radar on Orben Drive for three days. The FOP donated \$500 to the children of the police officer that died in Jersey City. Blue Diamond stated they do put stickers on items left behind; they will follow-up to make sure this procedure is being followed.

The Mayor stated that Lt. Keith Licata is researching the radar units that hang on the speed limit signs and the possibility of grant money for this purchase. The Mayor spoke

about the option of having neighboring residents purchase these radar signs and then they have a buy-in from the resident. The signs are movable and can be moved from area to area.



Replaced 2 bad grinder pumps 1 at 3 Lee Dr which had a bad stator relay which lets the pump know when to turn on due to level of water in pit. The second pump was at 7 Edgemere Ave which had a bad impeller bearing.

Started painting the stop bars in the Bertrand Island Section.

Dug test holes with the back-hoe at the beach for the engineer to better map out where old drain pipes were located for the Windemere flood control project.

Trimmed trees that were over hanging the volleyball court at the beach and trimmed the trees that were overhanging the civic center.

Installed 2 new batteries at the Sandra #2 sewage pumping station emergency generator.

Turned off 8 inch water main that was struck by contractor during construction was able to isolate leak on prospect and keep all but 1 resident with water until repairs could be made.

Repaired water break and restore water to the resident on Mt View Ave. Excavate around hole in water pipe and install repair pipe, flush out system and pressurize line and check for leaks and checked residents water for contaminants.

Delivered meals on wheels Monday and Thursday. There are 10 residents in the program with 41 meals being delivered on Mondays and 34 meals being delivered on Thursdays every week.

Cleaned and emptied office garbage cans at the Borough hall, civic center and the police station every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Cleaned, raked up and removed all sea weed at the beach every morning of the week. After cleaned up beach, sand is raked out and re-graded.

All 5 pump stations were inspected Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Every inspection day pump hours are logged, all alarms are inspected for proper operation, emergency generators fluids are checked, bioxide system is checked and gallons used and left in tank are logged, waste pit debris baskets are checked and cleaned if necessary. Every Friday waste pits are washed and the walls scraped down to remove grease than a degreasing agent is added to the waste pit to aid in the decomposition of grease that's builds up on the walls of the pit.

Removed dirt and gravel from the 3 water main gate valves boxes so we could access the top of the valves so we could turn them on once the line was ready to be opened, using the Jet Vac truck at the intersection of Howard and Prospect

Inspected and chlorinated new section of 8 inch water main that was installed on Prospect Ave. Opened valve to fill line than turn off valve and let water stay in pipe to dissolve chlorine after proper amount of settling time was reached opened fire hydrant at end of line and reopen valve and flush out pipes for 30 mins. While flushing was in progress multiple water tests were conducted to monitor the chlorine residual. Once the proper residual was achieved the valve that connects the water main to the MUA water main on Howard Blvd was opened and the system was put back on line.

Mowed the grass on Howard Blvd bend by Oneida Ave, and the Lake Rogerene Fire House

Cut down and or removed all grasses and brush that where covering the fire hydrants on Howard Blvd. Cut down low hanging branches on the old Howard Blvd.

Removed bamboo that is growing around fireman's field fence that growing into soccer area

Minor basin repair on Elizabeth Way. Top course of block installed and plaster interior walls

Raked out Fireman's field playground safety surface. Fill holes and depressions under swings and at the bottom of slides. Check equipment operation and check for bees nests.

Delivered meals on wheels Monday and Thursday. There are 10 residents in the program with 41 meals being delivered on Mondays and 34 meals being delivered on Thursdays every week.

Cleaned and emptied office garbage cans at the Borough hall, civic center and the police station every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Cleaned, raked up and removed all sea weed at the beach every morning of the week. After cleaned up beach, sand is raked out and re-graded.





- Whereas,** such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure that the application is properly completed and timely filed;


